Jewish Netroots Internship At the Jewish Funds for Justice

About us:

The Jewish Funds for Justice (jewishjustice.org) is a national public foundation guided by Jewish history and tradition. JFSJ helps people in the United States achieve social and economic security and opportunity by investing in healthy neighborhoods, vibrant Jewish communities, and skillful leaders. Our holistic approach to social change includes grantmaking and loans, service learning, leadership development, organizing, education, and advocacy.

The Jewish Funds for Justice is committed to developing the Jewish netroots ("internet grassroots") as a leading force for social change. To that end JFSJ created jspot.org, an online hub for netroots action and Jewish perspectives on contemporary issues of social and economic justice.

Jewish Netroots Internship:

The Jewish Funds for Justice seeks a part-time summer intern in New York City. The Jewish Netroots Intern will work with the Jewish Funds for Justice's Communications Department.

The intern's primary responsibility will be to help plan and implement Progressive Faith Blog Con, a conference for bloggers who write about progressive issues from a faith-based perspective. The intern will play a significant role in planning and implementing Progressive Faith Blog Con, which will take place during the summer of 2008. The Jewish Netroots Intern may also be involved in planning a non-partisan Jewish effort to educate and mobilize voters for the fall 2008 election.

The intern will have the opportunity to blog about progressive and Jewish issues on jspot.org.

Skills/Requirements:

The intern must have strong writing and project management skills. Experience with blogging, event planning, and Jewish activism is a plus.

Date/Time/Location:

The time frame for this internship is flexible, but the intern will work out of the Jewish Funds for Justice's New York City office three days per week during the summer of 2008. The intern must be available to start work by June 9, 2008.

Compensation:

The Jewish Netroots Internship is unpaid, but the intern will receive an unlimited monthly metrocard for the duration of the internship.
